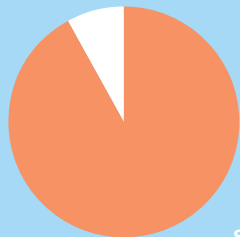

## Our research shows:

Financial crises are a critical barrier for low-income students struggling to complete their college degrees.



**92%**  
of teachers surveyed said  
“I have known a student who dropped out for financial reasons.”



**1 in 4**

students surveyed said that less than \$1,000 would have allowed them to stay in school.



Nearly  
**HALF**

of Chicago Public Schools students applying for federal financial aid have **ZERO** expected family contributions.

Teachers, administrators, counselors, and students all agree – a **Student Emergency Fund** providing timely financial assistance through a crisis would effectively help college students stay in school and graduate.
