

## **Solicitation for Proposals to Act as Fiscal Agent for the Chicago Continuum of Care**

The Chicago Continuum of Care (CCoC) is an unincorporated membership organization comprised of service providers, funders and individuals with lived experience whose collective mission is the coordination and collaboration of efforts to eliminate homelessness in the City of Chicago.

The CCoC is in the process of transitioning to a self-governing entity under a recently adopted [Charter](#). The [Charter](#) provides for the collection of membership dues which would help defray the costs of operations of the CCoC. However, until the CCoC becomes a legally recognized entity, it is not in a position to collect and administer such funds. Accordingly, the CCoC is soliciting proposals to act as Fiscal Agent on behalf of the CCoC until such time as the CCoC is able to assume such responsibilities.

### **Chicago CoC New Project Funding - Request for Proposals**

The Chicago Continuum of Care on Homelessness (CoC) has released two separate requests for proposals (RFP) for those interested in participating in the FY2014 HUD Continuum of Care Program Competition New Projects Process.

### **All proposals are due by 5:00 p.m. on Friday, October 9, 2015 and must be submitted electronically. No late submissions will be reviewed.**

HUD's Continuum of Care homeless assistance programs serve as the largest single source of funding for homeless services in Chicago. These grants are allocated through an annual application process known as the HUD CoC Program Competition. In previous years, HUD has set aside funding to support the development of New Projects to help end homelessness in our communities. Applying for a New Project requires completing an application process that is different than the one used for existing programs (also referred to as Renewal Projects).

The new project proposal forms can be accessed and submitted by following the instructions listed after each separate RFP description.
